## GENERAL INFORMATION



On June 10th, 1969 the Board of Commissioners for the Municipal Parks and Recreation Department came into existence. The City of Tomah Parks and Recreation Department under the direction of the Parks and Recreation Commission continues to plan, develop, and supervise the park system, recreation park, aquatic center and provide fun-filled recreational and leisure activities for the citizens of Tomah. The City of Tomah maintains over 120 acres of parks, green areas, and smaller tracts of land. The Parks and Recreation Department and its affiliates offer over 30 programs in recreation and leisure activities for youth, adult and special needs individuals. The City also operates a family aquatic center for the community. The goal is to insure the safety of the patrons during lesson instruction and open swimming. Recreation Park is the City of Tomah's special purpose park in that it functions as a location for larger events and gatherings. With its nearly 60 acres of land and numerous buildings, Recreation Park is by itself a small park system within the City of Tomah Parks and Recreation Department.

**Parent/Child Aquatics** Developed for children 6 months to 3 years, Parent and Child Aquatics helps young children get ready to swim by emphasizing fun in the water. Parents and children participate in several guided practice sessions that help children learn elementary skills, including water entry, bubble blowing, front kicking, back floating, underwater exploration and more.

**Pre-School Aquatics** Children ages 4 and 5 learn water safety, survival skills and foundational swimming concepts in a safe and fun environment. Skills are age-appropriate, allowing students to achieve success on a regular basis.

### Learn to Swim

Our six-level Learn-to-Swim program is unlike anything offered by other learn to swim programs. The program is designed for children over 6 years all the way up to adults, and students progress through the levels at their own pace, mastering the skills in one level before advancing to the next. What is it? An aerobic exercise that takes place on a specially designed stationary bicycle called a spinning bike. As you pedal, motivating music plays and the instructor talks you through a visualization of an outdoor cycling workout: "You're going up a long hill now; you can't see the top yet...." During the class you vary your pace -- sometimes pedaling as fast as you can, other times cranking up the tension and pedaling slowly from a standing position. This helps you to focus inwardly and work on your mind as well as your body.

### Fall boulevard tree planting project



The City of Tomah Parks and Recreation Department, in conjunction with the Frank G Andres Charitable Trust, is making trees obtainable, at no charge, to property owners for the purpose of boulevard planting this fall. An late September, early October delivery date is expected.

Sites must comply with the regulations found in City ordinance 48-19 to 48-37. [All planting, watering and trimming of trees shall be the responsibility of the individual property owner. Trees shall be planted in the middle of the boulevard. Trees that reach a maximum, mature height of greater than 18 feet shall not be planted under overhead transmission lines. Trees shall be planted at least 25 feet from street intersections. Large or medium-sized trees shall be planted at least 15 feet from driveways. Trees shall also be planted at least 10 feet from curb boxes or water shut-offs. Trees shall be spaced a minimum of 30 feet apart. No tree shall be planted in a boulevard less than four (4) feet in width.

The Tomah Parks and Recreation Department asks property owners who are interested in the tree program to file an application provided at the city clerk's office. Those who have experienced street construction recently and have lost shade trees as a result or those with homes that face the south or west are especially encouraged to apply. Phone calls will not be accepted. Parks and recreation employees will inspect the property to see that it conforms to ordinance. After the inspection, the employees will determine the appropriate specie of tree and stake the exact spot where it shall be planted. A copy of planting instructions will be attached to the tree.

Distribution will be made on a first come-first serve basis. The number of trees given to each property owner will be limited to **one (1)** per owner based on the availability of large and low-growing trees (to be planted under overhead transmission lines).

The species of trees available for distribution were chosen for their quickgrowth rate, tolerance to road salt, shallow root systems, inability to bear fruit, high resistance to serious diseases and insects and ability to to grow low enough so as not to interfere with overhead transmission lines.




